<p>Q: Do we need to use a lot of toothpaste to clean our teeth?</p> <p>A: No</p>	<p>Q: What does plaque do?</p> <p>A: Builds up on teeth and causes tooth decay</p>
<p>Q: What do canine teeth do?</p> <p>A: tear food</p>	<p>Q: What does plaque produce that is bad for teeth?</p> <p>A: acid</p>
<p>Q: What type of teeth do adults have that children do not?</p> <p>A: wisdom teeth</p>	<p>Q: How hard should your toothbrush be?</p> <p>A: medium</p>
<p>Q: What do incisors do?</p> <p>A: bite into food</p>	<p>Q: Name one food that is bad for teeth.</p> <p>A: sweets, chocolate ...</p>
<p>Q: Explain how we brush each tooth</p> <p>A: small circles (or up from the gum)</p>	<p>Q: What holds our teeth in our mouth?</p> <p>A: gums</p>

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<p>Q: Name one drink that is bad for your teeth.</p> <p>A: coke, fanta, cordial, ..</p>	<p>Q: What colour is plaque?</p> <p>A: white</p>
<p>Q: What do molars do?</p> <p>A: chew food</p>	<p>Q: When must we clean our teeth?</p> <p>A: before bed and after breakfast (and after sweets ideally!)</p>
<p>Q: How does your tongue help you eat?</p> <p>A: It pushes food around your mouth and to the back</p>	<p>Q: Why is milk good for you?</p> <p>A: It has calcium</p>
<p>Q: How many types of teeth do children have?</p> <p>A: 3</p>	<p>Q: Name the outer covering of teeth</p> <p>A: enamel</p>
<p>Q: Name the part of the tooth that sticks above the gum</p> <p>A: crown</p>	<p>Q: Name the part of the tooth that is in the gum</p> <p>A: root</p>
